Center Spotlight: Gheens Science Hall and Rauch Planetarium

Director: Dr. Tom Tretter

Vision: To provide a friendly, comfortable, hi-tech, multi-media, learning venue for the presentation of educational and entertaining programs supporting astronomy and space science education, the arts, humanities, and sciences.

The planetarium is designed to provide a unique learning environment primarily for astronomy and science education. It opened on UofL's campus in 1962 in memoriam of Rabbi Joseph Rauch for providing leadership in the spiritual, intellectual, and civic activities of Louisville as well as his wisdom and influence felt through his service to the board of trustees at the University of Louisville and the Louisville Free Public Library. Financial support for the new planetarium was announced in 1997 with the Gheens Foundation pledging \$1.1 million. In April 2001, the current Gheens Science Hall and Rauch Planetarium opened to the public.

Planetarium staff also provide shows, open to the public, for all ages. Visitors can view films in the 360-degree virtual reality, which allows for an immersive experience.

Grawemeyer Award in Education

Sara Goldrick-Rab, professor at Temple University,
was awarded the 2018 University of Louisville Grawemeyer
Award in Education for her 2016 book, *Paying the Price:
College Costs, Financial Aid, and the Betrayal of the
American Dream*, which examines the modern struggle to
pay for a college education in the U.S.

Goldrick-Rab found that students are being left
behind by soaring costs combined with a financial aid
system that has not kept up with demand. The result is a
generation that, during a time when a college education is
ever more important, is unable to get ahead because of
crushing debt and unfinished degrees.

The University of Louisville presents the
Grawemeyer Awards annually for outstanding works in
music composition, ideas improving world order,
psychology, and education, and gives a religion prize
jointly with Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary.
